
ORDER

OPINION ON DECISION

This matter was heard on 8/30/94.

INJURY - DISABILITY

Applicant was discharged by his employer on 2/23/91. The evidence establishes that his immediate supervisor (the cook) and the general manager fired him because they felt he was not doing his job (as a second cook) properly.


Applicant felt he was doing his work properly and was upset when he was fired. He did not sustain any injury or disability as a result of his employment. See medical reports, Dr. Weiss, M.D. (4/16/92) psychiatric report, Dr. Harris, M.D., 6/26/91, p. 7 (internal medicine).

The evidence at hearing and the above medical evidence supports the conclusion that the medical reports obtained by applicant are not to be relied upon. Applicant has sought employment and returned to regular employment.

No industrial injury was sustained in these cases. No benefits are due.
